Keeping Tank Bred Seahorses

For many years, seahorses have been nearly impossible to maintain in the aquarium due to their specific need for live foods in quantities that were just not feasible for the average hobbyist. Finally the collection of most wild collected seahorses has been banned giving way to the aquaculture industry to fill the void.

Tank raised seahorses actually eat frozen foods. With the regular feeding of frozen mysis shrimp, brine shrimp and grass shrimp combined with a vitamin enhancement product like Kent Zoe and Zoecon, seahorses can easily be maintained with good water quality. One thing to keep in mind though is that the seahorses must be housed with each other only for best results. Most fish species are just too aggressive at eating time causing the seahorses to become out competed for food, eventually leading to starvation. Animals like starfish, feather dusters and sea fans should make good companions in

the aquarium but always avoid stinging organisms like anemones. Cultures of macro-algae also are appreciated by seahorses giving them plenty of places to hang on while spending the day in the aquarium. Try setting up a small seahorse aquarium, they really become tame little guys once they are established.
