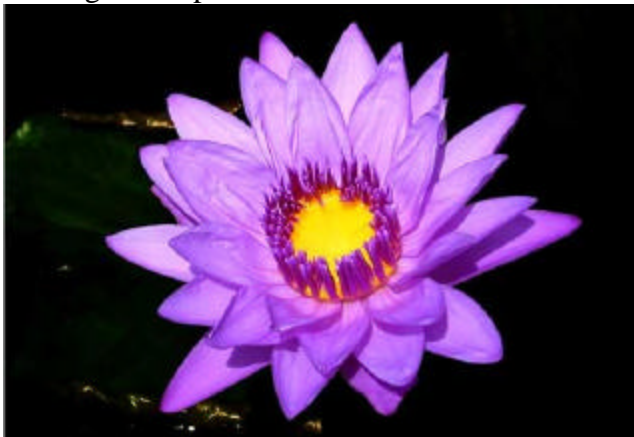

### OUR POND AREA OPENS THIS FRIDAY, MARCH 27!!

We have been working hard to get our pond area behind the store ready for Pond Season 2009!! If all goes as planned (it's raining all day Thursday), we will have our display pond redesigned and ready for viewing. We picked up pond plants on Tuesday and they are beautiful! The tropical lilies were housed in a green house and are already in full bloom. The hardy water lilies are fully leafed up and should begin sprouting buds within a couple of weeks. We also have an excellent selection of bog plants and floating island plants.



All of our pond vats are now filled with koi, goldfish and shubunkins. The goldfish are in full color. The shubunkins are large and in perfect condition. We have koi to suite every taste this year. First, we have domestic standard koi in both small and medium sizes. There is a wide

selection of color on these fish and they are quite inexpensive. Due to the KHV virus running rampant in Japan, we avoided Japanese koi this year. Instead, we brought in an A-Grade Premium Select Domestic koi shipment all bred from quality Japanese stock that have been in this country for several years. These fish are nothing but incredible. In fact, we find these fish to be of better quality than what we have received from Japan in previous seasons. We also have small and medium Butterfly Koi that



look stunning! These butterfly koi have lovely long fins and are available in multiple color combinations. So get your pond ready and come add some new fish and plants to your garden pond beginning on Friday, March 27<sup>th</sup>.



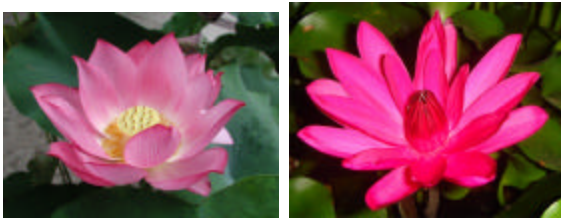
## ADDING PLECOSTOMUS TO THE GARDEN POND FOR ALGAE CONTROL



Many of our pond customers have been coming into the store wanting to add a plecostomus to their pond for algae control. Plecostomus are excellent for eating algae off the walls and about any other area of the pond they can clean. These fish are tropical species and rarely survive in water temperatures below 72 degrees. Though we have plenty of these fish to go around, the water temperature is still too cold for adding these fish to your pond safely. Keep a watch on your water temperature. Once you see that the temperature of the water remains at 75 degrees or better, then it will be safe to place these fish into your garden ponds and koi ponds. Try not to be impatient. These fish will only die if added when the water is too cold.

## WATER LOTUS AND NIGHT-BLOOMING LILIES

Though we do have a large selection of pond plants now in stock, we do not have lotus or night-blooming water lilies as of yet. Both of these plants emerge only after the night temperatures warm up so we should see both of these plants available by mid to late April. We will post on our newsletter when these plants are in stock for the season.
